1. Welcome and new member Introductions

The new team members introduced themselves (highlighted above in yellow). The rest of the team provided short introductions for the benefit of the new members.

2. Design Parameters Tool Update (15 min)

Jim Mahugh and Daniele Dunjic from the HQT's WSDOT Design shared an update of the new Design Parameters tool, which is a huge enhancement over what is currently begin used. This new tool will help new engineers with the design process as a proactive measure rather than just a documentation exercise. Jim went through the Excel tool and described the process and features. This tool will also be in better alignment with the BOD. This was developed as part of a statewide effort and a committee was set up to work on this. The committee is doing some final review of this tool and it is nearly ready for some final testing. Full documentation will be developed, and a design directive will introduce this tool once its ready to implement. This will also bring statewide consistency in this documentation. Jim and Daniele will be sharing this at the next Project Development meeting in March to get some additional feedback before this is implemented. Suryata mentioned that this ACEC team can be used as a good tester of this tool as well, including reviewing the instructional documentation that will go into a design directive. Jim will keep that in mind.

3. Charter Update and New Member Discussion

Steve Olling presented the revised version of the team charter and will send that out to the team with these meeting notes. Don Sims will work with Lisa Reid to decide who will remain on the committee since we can't have more than one member from the same ACEC firm on the team.

4. Design Manual & Project Delivery Memos

Rafael showed the location of the project delivery memos on the WSDOT site. None have been added since the last ACEC meeting in November 2023 and the ASDE's are looking at cleaning some of these up as part of the 2024 design manual update. Some of them, as discussed last meeting, are related to other manuals, such as the Utility Manual. Once those manuals get updated, these PDM's can be retired. Rafael also showed the design manual update review schedule, which is planned to begin in late April this year. As in the past two years, Steve Olling will be the coordinator for the ACEC members in this review process so there is one point of submittal for the ACEC members to HQT's. **Stay tuned!!**

5. Staff Updates

- HQ Development Division
 - Rafael showed the latest ASDE organization chart. This has now been filled up. Here is the link to the org chart

6. New Focus Areas

- Plan For Approval process Steve brought up a table to document the discussion, asking two questions on this PFA process and documentation:
 - o What's going well?
 - O What needs improvement?

Each Region representative started and then the ACEC members added input. The table is attached to these notes and this discussion will continue at the next meeting to finalize more action items to improve the process, which is mainly related to statewide consistency and clearer mention if the PFA and process in the Design Manual.

Joseph developed and shared a Design Document Workflow diagram document that helps the Olympic Region navigate these processes. This is provided along with these meeting notes. This is an excellent visual tool to help navigate several design processes, including the PFA.

There are some action items that can be looked at now before the next meeting:

- Look at how the PFA shows up in the Design Manual and look for a better place for it, or at least in multiple areas. It doesn't have that much exposure in the design manual where it resides buried in Chapter 1130, Development Services. Rafael and Chad will begin to look into this.
- Each Region representative to look at their internal PFA process and compare that to the process flow that Joseph provided. Is it the same? What differences are there in the other Region's.
